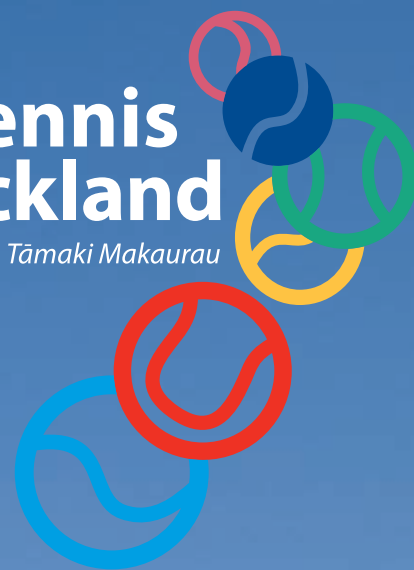

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Delegate meetings have now been streamlined to the extent that workshops on matters of importance to clubs, such as increasing membership and fundraising, have taken place without extending the duration of meetings. Much positive value has been tabled as a result and furthermore, a little levity has been added. Long may this continue.

I observe that the Tennis Auckland Board have many pressing matters of importance to resolve. I hope that when the rebuilding of the ASB Tennis Centre is complete, the restructuring of Tennis Auckland administration has been finalised, the Tennis Auckland Board can focus more on fundamentals which concern club members.

It was very pleasing to see when visiting clubs involved in Scarbro Caro Bowl, the high standard of spectator facilities compared to just a short time ago. This has resulted in much larger, more enthusiastic crowds watching very exciting tennis of the highest standard. If you haven't been to one of these matches, I can thoroughly recommend that you do. This year the tournament starts two weeks later which is a step in the right direction.

The Fiji Xerox Auckland Championships were very successfully conducted at the Scarbro Tennis Centre indoors, under a new format. Once again the tennis was enthralling.

Of course our sport would hardly exist if not for volunteers at all levels, and I am so impressed by the enthusiasm and dedication of those who give so much time so others can enjoy. You may not realise that the international tournaments also have a huge number of volunteers so capably lead by Guy Nash. Finally I wish incoming President Pam Sowter the very best for the coming year, with all its challenges. I hope she and husband Norm enjoy it as much as Lynley and I have.



## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

On behalf of the Tennis Auckland Board, it is again my pleasure to report on the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2010.

On the retirement of Graham Pearce, after some 20 years of leading Tennis Auckland, our new CEO, Greig Bramwell, was appointed during the year after an extensive and wide ranging recruiting process.

Greig's appointment was in the midst of the final stages of negotiations of the redevelopment project at the ASB Tennis Centre and the commencement of construction in March 2010.

It was an appropriate time to review the organizational structure of Tennis Auckland to ensure that we were in the best shape to meet changing times put in place by the new project and to ensure that we maintained our club focus. The Tennis Auckland Board believes that we are now ready and poised for the future.

At the AGM last year, I advised that the Tennis Auckland Board was disappointed at the financial loss for 2009.

For the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2010, a much better result was achieved, but is still inadequate. The Tennis Auckland Board has instituted significant changes to Tennis Auckland, as noted above, and we are determined to ensure that an adequate and sustainable appropriate return is achieved in the future.

For the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> April 2010 a cash profit of \$21,770 was achieved (2009 \$105k loss).

The 2010 year was an appropriate time to revalue our assets due to the redevelopment of the ASB Tennis Centre. The insured value of our assets is now reflected in the financial accounts which results in the equity standing at \$3.362m (2009 \$454k).

Due to the disruption of the redevelopment, we expect the net result for 2011 to be similar to 2010, but from then on we are endeavoring to achieve appropriate results, after depreciation.

The Board joins me in expressing our thanks to our CEO Greig Bramwell and his staff for doing a great job under difficult circumstances during the year. Our thanks also to President Jon Olsen, who provided valuable input to Board meetings and for his enthusiastic and valuable representation of Tennis Auckland.

Finally, my sincere thanks to all Tennis Auckland Board members who have contributed so much during the year and who have set a new stage for Tennis Auckland in the future.



## **CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT**

It has been a challenging and defining year for Tennis Auckland and I take this opportunity to thank and acknowledge the ongoing support of all our clubs, members, staff and sponsors.

The changes and issues we have worked through have provided us with the people, resources and structure to increase the profile of tennis within the Auckland region through the delivery of a higher level of services and facilities to you our stakeholders.

The coming year will have many opportunities to build on the 2009/10 year's gains and combined with your continued support it will also be a very rewarding year as the initiatives undertaken positively impact on tournaments, events, clubs and player participation.

### **Highlights and Outcomes of 2009/2010 were:**

#### **NGC Project**

- This is a cornerstone project for Tennis Auckland and in partnership with Next Generation Clubs this seven year vision is becoming a reality at the ASB Tennis Centre.
- The support of the Ngati Whatua, Auckland City Council and the Tennis Auckland Board have ensured that this facility will be world class and it will be showcased during the 2012 Heineken Open Men's and ASB Classic Women's tournaments. The official opening of the facilities will be mid 2011.

#### **ASB Tennis Centre Dome Removal**

- This has been designated for installation at the Manukau Tennis Centre. Negotiations with the Manukau City Council are well underway, with the final Tennis Auckland Board approval, subject to the approval of our Council submission.
- The installation of the dome here will significantly improve the facilities, making the tennis centre an additional resource for members, clubs and tournaments.

#### **Wilson Carpark**

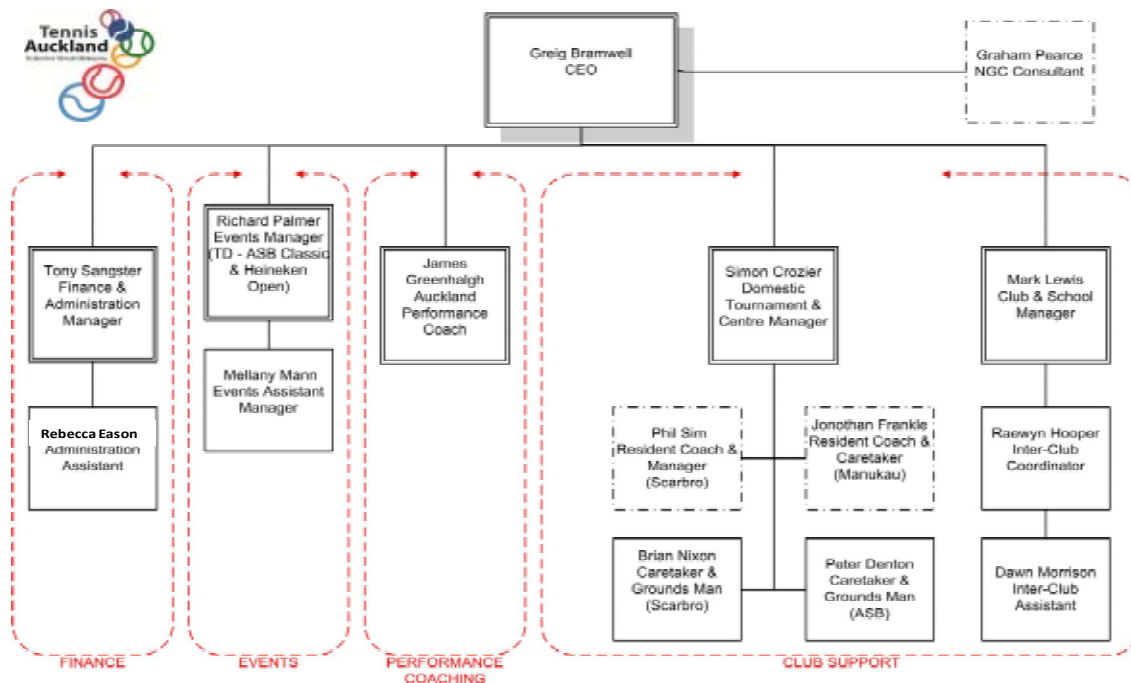
- The Carpark has produced improved returns throughout the year as a result of Wilson's continued promotional campaigns. These improved returns should continue on into the 2010/2011 financial year.

#### **Marketing**

- With the support of our high profile and committed international tournament sponsors and domestic organisation/competition sponsors we have in place a great team for the coming years.
- We are very pleased to have confirmed DB/Heineken as principal sponsor for the men's open. Joining Heineken for the first time as the Title Sponsor for the Heineken Open was Panasonic and we look forward to working with them more closely in the future.
- ASB and Kia Motors continue in their outstanding support of the ASB Classic women's international tournament.
- We also would like to make a special mention of the ongoing support Graham Windross of Zealandia Horticulture has made in support of the ASB Classic.

## Structure

- Tennis Auckland has embarked on a total re-structure of its organisation. The objective behind the re-structure was to create well defined departments which are more accountable and responsible for the organisations performance. These outcomes ensure we have sustainability throughout our domestic organisation as well as focusing on making the two international tournaments bigger and better. It has also provided the opportunity for staff to develop and use their skills and expertise in their new roles as shown below.

## Events

### Tournaments

- Once again the two international tournaments were extremely successful, and something that we should all be very proud of. The success of these tournaments is testament to the commitment of the Tennis Auckland staff, Major Events Committee and the hundreds of volunteers; thank you to you all.

## **Coaching**

### **Performance Pathway**

- Auckland's two best performing players, Marina Erakovic and Sacha Jones were both hampered by injury this year. Despite that, Sacha still managed to reach a career high WTA ranking of 157. This ranking was largely due to an amazing string of results in the latter part of 2009 when Sacha won four consecutive tournaments on the ITF Women's Circuit. However Marina's injuries limited her ability to play and her ranking dropped from a career best ranking of 49. She is currently back on the circuit and we support her in the climb back to where she belongs.
- Adam Lee enjoyed a degree of success on the ITF Junior Circuit. Adam reached a career best ITF World Junior ranking of 91 during the year. Two other former squad players enjoyed success at major junior tournaments. Jordan Cox caused a major stir by reaching the final of the Junior Boys Singles at Wimbledon. Not to be outdone, Sean Berman, who now resides in Australia, had a wild ride all the way to the final of the Australian Junior Championships. Another former squad member to impress was France based Sebastian Lavie.
- A number of other up and coming junior players performed well on the national stage. Chris Simich, Cameron Norrie, Alex Klitcharov, Monica Chen, Claudia Williams and Arash Hafezi all had success nationally and at this stage are showing good potential.
- Auckland boy's teams did well at the National Teams Event earlier this year. The 14's team proved too strong for the rest of the country winning the national team's event title. While the 16's team came within a whisker of winning the title. Our girls did not fare so well this year largely due to injury and player unavailability.

### **Schools Program**

- The school visit programme had a bumper year and continued to offer children the opportunity to play tennis in the school yard. Without this programme, thousands of children would probably never get a chance to swing a racquet. In the last year we made 31 visits to schools in Auckland giving 5600 children the opportunity to play the game in a fun, active environment.

### **Grasshoppers**

- In 2009 – 18 schools and 5,232 children undertook Grasshoppers in the Tennis Auckland Region representing a 7% return of these children into club activities.
- This figure had grown from the 2008 figure of 6 schools and 1,945 children. The full list of schools and coaches and clubs who delivered Grasshoppers in 2009 is contained below.

### Grasshoppers Tournaments

- GHTs provide children with a new way to start playing tennis and at a level appropriate for beginners (in three developmental stages consistent with the ITF Play and Stay programme) and with modified equipment and rules.
- In the Tennis Auckland Region 9 coaches conducted 38 tournaments and over 707 children participated in the Grasshoppers Tournament.
- The largest tournament was conducted at Remuera Rackets Club by Troy Turnbull in March with 58 children participating at the three introductory levels.
- The highlight of the Grasshoppers Tournament programme was the opportunity for Holly Stewart (Remuera) and Tiana Windbuchler (Cockle Bay) to compete against World No. 1's Cara Black and Leisel Huber at the 2010 ASB Classic on Centre Court.



- Both girls were selected as the best performed of the Grasshoppers series prior to Christmas.

### Open Day

- Tennis Auckland was the only region with an increase in clubs registering, from 34 clubs in 2008/09 to 41 clubs in 2009/10. There were approximately 684 people attending throughout the open day, and 242 new members signed up. Most people found out about the open day by flyers advertising in the local newspaper. Flyers were the dominant source of information, with a high percentage coming as a result of information from the club or club members. Even though the weather wasn't perfect – most clubs still felt it was a worthwhile promotion for their club. We look forward to developing this promotion further in the coming years. Thank you to those clubs that participated.

### Easi Tennis

- A very popular programme particularly after Christmas with 220 participants. Again the extra advertising in the Canvas publication in the Herald helped tremendously. A pleasing increase in numbers at Scarbro Tennis Centre. We could only hold classes at the ASB Tennis Centre before Christmas due to the venue being unavailable in 2010 with the reconstruction process. The link to clubs was encouraged with the opportunity for clubs to introduce themselves to participants. We need more clubs doing this to gain more benefit from the programme. Some clubs are starting to run their own.

### Interclub

#### Senior Interclub

- Another successful season with another increase in the overall team numbers up by 41 to 537. Again a feature of the competitions was the closeness of many grades with very few teams obviously in grades inappropriate to their ability levels. There were also fewer defaults.
- Scarbro Caro Bowl saw West End win the Men's Trophy and Parnell the Women's. The debrief meeting was attended by all participating clubs and healthy discussion saw some close voting and new innovations on the venue / fixture management for 2010/11.
- Cockle Bay won the Alan White Trophy as Senior Club of the Year, and Sacha Jones, the Jack & Gwen Glenie trophy as Senior Player of the Year. The newly created Senior Interclub of the year was won by Jellicoe Park.
- Thanks to all Interclub Controllers and participants and in particular Raewyn Hooper for a difficult job superbly done. Also thanks to Scarbro Construction for sponsoring the Caro Bowl, both Senior and Junior.
- Teams competing in the Senior Interclub competitions numbered 537. This is broken down into the following:

- Weekend Interclub        397
- Twilight Interclub        55
- Winter Interclub        85

- A positive debrief of Senior Interclub controllers will see some changes for the 2010/11 season. The season was rounded out with a very successful prize giving with 34 clubs receiving recognition. We were literally packed to the rafters with Club awards being recognised for the first time.

#### BarterCard Ladies Midweek Competition

- A variety of competitions were again offered to midweek ladies. This season's numbers in the Lead In competition remained about the same but for the first time in years, summer interclub numbers increased. Changes to the summer interclub structure were made and hopefully next season we will see an increase in numbers. Thanks also to Colleen Edmonds and her team for organising a very successful Charity Day, which raised money for the Halberg Trust.

#### Junior Interclub

- With the continued large numbers of teams, court and administrative resources were again stretched to the limit with the sharing of courts on some occasions. If more teams could look to play on Sunday this would help ease court availability pressure. The use of school courts in the afternoon for beginner interclub has also helped, as has the use of courts at the new netball centre in Morrin Road.
- Campbell Park won the Junior Club of the Year award.
- The Scarbro Junior Caro Bowl was again closely contested and proved very successful and included entries from Tennis Northern teams. The boy's competition was won by Remuera and the girls by Royal Oak.
- Thanks to all players, team captains and parents and in particular Interclub Controllers for making 2009/10 a successful season. Also to Dawn Morrison for her outstanding work with Junior Interclub and administration of TOPDOG.

### **Other Competitions**

#### BarterCard Ladies Indoor Doubles Competition

- Another very popular competition. The formats for each grade were numbers driven. Practical having an initial round to grade teams into appropriate levels was very successful. Teams could be placed in appropriate grades for the second competition based on their results in the first competition making for closer competition.

#### BarterCard Ladies Indoor Singles

- A very popular event. The Term 4 competition was full nine weeks before entries closed. Next year with the ASB Tennis Centre being unavailable we will look at adding extra time slots to cater for as many people as possible. We also need to make players more accountable for playing the matches at the scheduled time rather than re arranging them and inconveniencing their opponents. C Grade attracted larger numbers 134 people participated.

#### The University of Auckland Short Course Indoor Competition

- The University of Auckland Business School indoor tennis competition consisted of two competitions each lasting seven weeks. This format was necessary due to the uncertainty of the start of the redevelopment programme. The outcome of this split was that we avoided school holidays and clashing with junior events and the resulting court availability problems but the drawback was it did not allow us to hold a grading round. With only one venue available in 2010 we will be running the same format again. A-grade again attracted insufficient entries and those who entered were incorporated into B-grade which was split into sections based on team ability level.

#### Fuji Xerox Auckland Senior Champs

- This was held at Scarbro Tennis Centre and run by Ross Morrison. The Grading Band and Masters Events were held separately with the Grading Band section. The winner of the Grading Band Section was offered a wildcard into the qualifying of the NZMT 3. Once again entry numbers for both the Grading Band and Masters sections were disappointing, with no entries received for the women's section. Serious consideration must be given to the viability of running these

Grading Band events. It may be that a club takes over the running of these events based on the successful events held at Royal Oak, Pompallier, and Remuera etc.

- The Wheelchair section was held over the weekend 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> December and is now no longer part of the ITF circuit so we took over the organisation of their event.

#### NZMT 3 – Fuji Xerox Auckland Championships

- This year Tennis Auckland hosted only one Tennis New Zealand Money Tournament - NZMT 3, acting as the Open section of the Auckland Senior Championships. A new initiative was trialled for the President's Dinner and NZMT 3 finals evening with club Presidents and invited guests seated at tables courtside and served drinks and nibbles while watching the men's and women's NZMT 3 finals. This concept proved very popular and is an idea worth developing in the future. An Open Doubles event was also held on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December with small entries received for both the men's and women's sections.

#### Spring Tournament – Kia Motors Amateur Open Tournament

- Held at Scarbro Tennis Centre. This year the tournament was sponsored by Kia Motors New Zealand and had an added incentive for participants. The winners of both the men's and women's Open Section won a trip to Melbourne to represent New Zealand at the Kia Amateur Australian Open Tournament. This is held prior to the Australian Open and next year this may be expanded to include other regions and a national play off.
- Thanks to Ross Morrison and Mellany Mann for the superb job they did in organising and running this event. Also to Todd McDonald and Michelle Griven from Kia Motors New Zealand for the sponsorship and going the extra mile to make this something special.



## MAJOR EVENTS CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

There is an old ballad that has an opening line – “There’s a long long trail awinding” – and this could well be in the minds of many tennis players when they reminisce about their participation in Auckland’s International Tournaments. When we consider player results we can trace a trail from Auckland to many major tournament successes after they have graced our courts at the ASB Tennis Centre. 2010 is no different with four more notable examples:

- (i) Francesca Schiavone a losing semi finalist ASB Classic winning the French Open at Roland Garros
- (ii) Our Heineken Open Champion John Isner creating a world record for winning the world’s longest match after 11 hours and a mammoth 70-68 fifth set (Wow)
- (iii) Honorary Kiwi Horia Tecau men’s doubles champion at Auckland losing the Wimbledon men’s doubles final where all four players have appeared at Auckland.
- (iv) The Wimbledon men’s doubles champions Jurgen Melzer and Philipp Petzschner were first round losers at Auckland.

And the list could go on and on; so many successful players have played at Auckland.

For the 2010 events the weather was comparatively kind with only a few hours lost to inclemency. The good tennis made us aware how tough the tournament circuit can be.

In the ASB Classic our girls fell in the first round of the qualifiers and Marina Erakovic lost both her first round matches (in the doubles to the ultimate winners).

In the Heineken Open the boys did better with some wins in the first round of qualifiers but in the main draw successes as Rubin Statham went through to the second round; albeit defeating Daniel King-Turner in an entertaining match. Then Kiwi Marcus Daniell with Horia Tecau won the Heineken Open doubles. A feat that has rarely occurred in our tennis history (Wow again).

The quality of the tennis reflects the reputation of the tournaments among the circuit players but is also recognition of the reputation and hard working capabilities of our Tournament Directors; Brenda Perry and Richard Palmer. The prospect of quality tennis also attracts considerable crowd support and Tennis Auckland is grateful for the way in which the Auckland tennis public patronise these events at the ASB Tennis Centre and the players also appreciate playing in a stadium filled with a discerning audience.

Tennis Auckland also values the contribution of the large team of volunteers coupled with the professional staff who put in a considerable effort, mostly in their holiday time, to ensure that the tournaments are successful and provide a pleasant experience for all participants.

### **ASB CLASSIC - Featuring KIA Motors Singles and Doubles**

Our tournament, one of the first on the Sony Ericson WTA Tour, continues to attract players from all over the world. This year, 29 nations were represented with many from Europe including a strong group from France and the bulk of the 2009 Federation Cup Champion team from Italy. Many players from Europe choose to come to “sunny” New Zealand to acclimatise before the Australian Open.

Brenda Perry, the Tournament Director, encouraged a strong group of players to come to Auckland. We welcomed Jill Craybas from the USA who was back for her 11th visit; we appreciate her continued loyalty but her stay was fairly short losing her first round matches in both singles and doubles.

Tucked away in the chip lists were several champions from the past, notably Eleni Daniilidou (who sadly lost out in the qualifiers) and others in the doubles. Most notable was the doubles pairing of Cara Black and Liezel Huber now ranked No 1 in the world. Brenda had offered wild cards to two interesting players. Firstly Kimiko Date Krumm the veteran player from Japan who is continuing her stunning come-back trail and secondly Yanina Wickmayer the youngster from Belgium who has been harshly treated by the Drug Testing Agency.

The first day of the qualifiers play concluded at 9.15 pm (nearly a 12 hour day) and on the three late nights all finished at 11ish (the latest 11.20 pm). We did experience some minor rain delays but our usually



efficient team of court dryers ensured that the down time was minimised. The rest of the week was fine with some days being challengingly hot.

The tournament produced some high quality matches with the qualifying event producing the fiercest competition of the 28 matches, 12 went to three sets with a total of nine tie breakers. In the main draw singles only three matches went to the third set but this does not mean matches were one sided. The seeds again faced the sword early in the tournament with only three seeds reaching the quarter finals. No one on the tour gives up easily and we witnessed some great tennis from some fine athletes. In the doubles half the matches went to the third set match tiebreaker with one match being won by 7-6(13) 3-6 16-14.

The final results showed that (3) Wickmayer defeated (1) Flavia Pennetta 6-3 6-2 and Cara Black and Liezel Huber beat Natalie Grandin and Laura Granville 7-6(4) 6-2.

Wickmayer was later very emotional in showing gratitude to Brenda and the tournament for giving her the wild card and the opportunity to show her tennis talents.

She is adamant that she is not a drug cheat and wants to put the misunderstandings behind her. In winning the ASB Classic she now has a new bright red flowering plant named after her courtesy of Zealandia Nurseries who are a generous benefactor of tennis in Auckland.

#### Notable details

- Li Na (China) 2<sup>nd</sup> seed lost in first round but semi finalist at the Australian Open
- Heritage Charity Evening with Auction and Lobbo returned \$16,000 for Starship. The Lobbo activity is real fun but a dangerous pastime for MC Simon Dallow who seemed to be the target for some "media shots".
- Grasshoppers group of young children produced an on court display of activities showing enthusiasm, energy and some skills
- The players enjoyed an on-shore party down in the Viaduct Basin area and several participated in visits to horse racing and Harbour visits
- Sadly Sacha Jones had to withdraw from the ASB Classic with muscle strain - what a pity as we were looking forward to seeing her on court after a good year on the circuit
- Other on-court activities included the ASB Ball Hit Out, Lufthansa Hit for Cash and KIA Motors car races.

#### **HEINEKEN OPEN - Featuring Heineken Singles and Doubles**

The Heineken Open traditionally commences before the ASB Classic concludes and with the continued support from Tennis Northern the first and second rounds of the qualifying event were played on the Saturday and Sunday at Albany.

A lighter entry level saw Saturday play finish much earlier than previous years, with the full Sunday schedule completed very smoothly providing four culminating matches to be played at the ASB Tennis Centre first thing Monday morning.

Richard Palmer had attracted a truly international field to the Heineken Open. 21 Nations were represented in our line ups for the week with a large team from Spain providing the top four seeds.

The field included three previous Champions and a former World No. 1. However, reputations and the seeding list are not guarantees for success and after just one match three of the top four seeds were on their way to Australia and only four seeded players made it to the quarter finals (two only to the semis).

Improved weather conditions – no time was lost during the day sessions (only nights) – saw some great tennis; hard fought matches. Over the week 18 matches went to three sets with 14 tiebreakers and in the doubles, five matches went to the match tiebreaker (third set). Some tight scheduling – particularly on the Tuesday and Wednesday – saw some long days (Monday 11.20 pm finish, Tuesday 11.30 pm, Wednesday 12 midnight finish) while Thursday was very extended by wet weather requiring considerable effort from the court drying team (including the ATP Tour Supervisor).

Despite delays we arrived at finals day all square. Both finals were very good matches – Big John Isner (2.06m) won an interesting tussle with terrier like Arnaud Clement 6-3 5-7 7-6(2) and wonder of wonders local lad Marcus Daniell combined with Horia Tecau to defeat Marcelo Melo and Bruno Soares 7-5 6-4. A great Kiwi victory.

Some notable details

- John Isner smacked down 78 aces
- Arnaud Clement was a late recruit due to some clever behind the scenes telephone calls
- Perhaps not so notable – World No 1 doubles pairing of the Bryan brothers were sent packing in the first round
- David Nalbandian (former world No 3) had to withdraw with an abdominal strain
- Kids' Day – now on the Monday went off well with some of the pros creating a fun experience for the youngsters.
- Social activities with a nautical flavour where the players enjoyed the Viaduct Basin atmosphere and refreshment before spending some time cruising in the harbour
- Traditional on-court entertainment with Heineken Big Serve, KIA Car Race, Panasonic Ball Hit Out and live music entertained the crowd around the stadium court.
- Heineken After Party. Party Central on courts four, five and six provide a great location with atmosphere for patrons to watch the finals on a big screen enjoy great music and share typical Heineken hospitality. This is a great way to celebrate a great event in a well presented venue. Well done Heineken.

## CONCLUSION

As the 2010 International Tournaments conclude we draw the curtain on the good old facilities we once knew as Stanley Street then as the ASB Tennis Centre. It is with some nostalgia that we farewell the old stadium. But it is with great excitement that we look forward to the new development, in conjunction with Next Generation Clubs, where a wonderful new facility will be built to provide the home of Tennis Auckland combining with a modern up-market recreational complex.

Our brief but intense international season again produced many highlights and enjoyable sessions. This does not happen automatically but is the result of the players' commitment and of the considerable effort of a large team of people most ably led by Brenda Perry, Richard Palmer and our new CEO Greig Bramwell providing support. Thanks to the team for their enthusiasm and friendly manner in which they go about the many tasks supporting the tournament.

Thanks also to the Major Sponsors ASB, Heineken, KIA Motors, Panasonic and all the other contributing organizations including Heritage Hotels, Auckland City, Coca Cola, Zealandia and others that provide financial or material support. Your input is much appreciated.

The media; print, visual and audio, again presented the tournament to the public with a high level of professionalism. We thank you for your efforts.

Lastly, a word of thanks to the tennis public; we appreciate the fact that people come to watch good tennis. We can assure you that the "New Horizons" for the ASB Tennis Centre will provide a great venue with increased comfort and easier access to enjoy our tournaments in the future.



# **HONORARY SUB-ASSOCIATIONS**

## **TENNIS AUCKLAND UMPIRES ASSOCIATION**

Every year the two major Events in January, the WTA ASB Classic and the ATP Heineken Open give our members the opportunity to showcase their skills at the highest level and this year was no exception; clearly contributing to the huge success of both these events. The New Zealand and particularly Auckland umpire content selected for both these events and for final days were the highest ever reflecting the high skill of our members.

These events were also tinged with sadness as we farewelled two of our longest serving members, David Crymble and Jill Hatley, who have contributed enormously to our Association and Tennis Officiating with their 30 years and 25 years respectively. I was privileged to speak of their achievements and present two beautiful celebratory recognition trophies to them.

David had an outstanding career as both an International Referee and Chair Umpire and was selected for both the Seoul 88 and Barcelona 92 Olympics. David officiated at numerous Grand Slams and is well remembered for his officiating the Seles vs. Tauziat match where the former's grunting was the subject of scrutiny. Jill Hatley officiated at every major Event in Auckland in January consecutively for the last 25 years and not only was made a Life Member of our Association in 2002 but was Secretary of our association for 11 years. We and tennis are clearly indebted to both of them.

Over the last year our members have produced outstanding performances on the local, national and international scene and continue to be very highly regarded. Blaze Trifunovski is our only full time official and over the last year became one of the most highly regarded review officials (electronic replay) in the world spending 19 weeks in this role with the highlight clearly being the ATP Finals in London with the world's 8 best singles and doubles teams competing. Additionally he officiated at the highest ATP, WTA and ITF levels as a chair umpire in excess of 100 matches.

We currently have 5 internationally certified officials with John Barry, Stephen Noble and David Smith certified as International Referees; Blaze Trifunovski as an International Chair Umpires and Dimitar Trifunovski as a White Badge Official. In the last year Stephen Noble was appointed as Chief of Umpires for the Davis Cup Tie in New Plymouth between New Zealand and China and more recently David Smith was appointed by the ITF as the Referee for the Davis Cup Tie in February between Malaysia and Indonesia in Kuala Lumpur and last month as the Referee for the Tie between Australia and Japan in Brisbane

Additionally the last year has seen John Barry and David Smith respectively the Referees of the Heineken Open and ASB Classic in January of this year, Stephen Noble the Chief of Umpires for both of these events. John Barry was also the Referee for the ITF U18 Winter Indoor Event and the U18s ITF Tournament.

In addition, I wish to congratulate John Barry who was awarded the Top Official in NZ award at the Tennis NZ Awards.

One of our Association's main focuses is the ongoing training and mentoring of officials and in this regard I cannot thank particularly John and Lynly Barry and Stephen Noble for volunteering their time on countless occasions to run Referee, Rules of Tennis and Line Umpires courses for new and existing members which were all very well attended. Additionally David Smith took a Chair Umpire Course, modelled on the ITF Level 1 Programme last year and both John Barry and David Smith will be tutoring similar courses again in the next couple of months. We value their knowledge and the fact that they are committed to sharing this.

## **TENNIS SENIORS AUCKLAND**

Tennis Seniors Auckland is living proof that tennis is a game for persons of all ages and all skill levels. Our “season” runs from April to August (i.e. during the off months from the standard tennis season). This means that our members often have to deal with wet courts and wintry conditions. Despite this the numbers wanting to play in our various events continues to be steady.

The National Teams Event held every Easter is clearly the most popular Seniors event on the calendar with over 500 players competing in Tauranga this year. Auckland is traditionally well represented, and this year was no different. In addition to its own Auckland teams, in several age groups Auckland and South Auckland members combined to form teams to enable even more of our members to compete. Overall Auckland players were involved in winning teams in several age groups. The standard of tennis at these events is extremely high; our Under 40 men’s team being comprised entirely of Caro Reserve level men was only able to achieve 2<sup>nd</sup> place!

The Easter team’s event, however, as with all Seniors events, is about much more than winning. The camaraderie that develops between players from all over New Zealand over the three days of competition is amazing. Many of the teams have been together and playing against each other for many years. One or two faces may change each year as players move into an older age group but for many the opportunity to catch up with old friends is as important as the tennis.

Auckland has also had players performing with distinction in international events, national events and regional tournaments throughout the year.

During the year Auckland Seniors played representative fixtures against Waikato, North Harbour, Counties, South Auckland and Lower Northland. (The match against Northland was rained out). With an increasing membership, especially with those wanting to play competitive tennis, the pressure for places in these representative teams is increasing. The secondary school competition in 2010 involved 347 six-member teams (206 boys' teams and 141 girls' teams) from 59 schools in the greater Auckland area. The numbers remain almost exactly the same as in 2009. We have been puzzled for the last few years about why there have been twice as many girls' teams entered in the Senior grade as in the Intermediate and Junior grades. It probably takes more work to organize younger teams, but it is a pity if some of these juniors are missing out on the opportunity of playing competitively. Nonetheless there are over two thousand pupils playing tennis each Saturday, stretching the capacity of the available courts. Again we are grateful for the longstanding co-operation which has existed between Tennis Auckland and the ASSTA, with Richard Palmer and his team doing a great job in ensuring that all the competitions get a share of the available courts. We wish Richard well as he takes on new responsibilities, but will be sorry to have less contact with him than in past years.

Fortunately, the good weather in February and March meant that our first term programme was completed with only minor interruptions. Our competitions conclude with three weeks of play-off rounds in Term 4.

The Champion of Champions tournament in March as usual attracted a good entry of top players. Finals day was held this year at Scarbro Tennis Centre. Whereas last year there had been a close battle for the girls' James Aitkenhead Shield, this year the boys provided the cliff-hanger. St Kentigern took the girls' shield by a wide point's margin ending St Cuthbert's long tenure, while Auckland Grammar took a step towards regaining their former glory by sharing the boys' shield with Westlake.

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a. REPORTING ENTITY

Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

The financial statements of Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

The Society qualifies for differential reporting based on the following criteria:

- i/ it is not publicly accountable and
- ii/ the Society is 'not large' as defined by the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants

The Society has adopted all available reporting exemptions.

#### b. MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed by the entity. Accrual accounting is used to recognise income and expenses as they occur.

#### c. SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied:

##### i. Depreciation

Depreciation is charged on a straight-line basis at rates appropriate to the estimated economic life of each category of asset.

The assets of Tennis Auckland Region (Inc) are depreciated according to the following rates:

a) Buildings	4%	of cost (written off over 25 years)		
b) Stadium Improvements	6.67%	"	"	15 "
c) Court Developments	6.67 to 16.67%	"	"	5 to 15 "
d) Courtside Boxes	6.67%	"	"	15 "

#### Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are recorded at original cost price less accumulated depreciation. The Society has a policy of expensing items of a minor capital nature as appropriate. The Board has approved that the assets values be recognised at the 2009 insurance value by way of a general asset revaluation reserve. This is further detailed in Note 6.

### **ii. Foreign Currency Transactions**

Transactions in foreign currency are, unless covered by forward exchange contracts at the forward rate of the contract, translated into the reporting currency by use of the spot rate or rate approximating this rate in effect at the transaction date

Transactions in foreign currency not settled in the accounting period resulting in monetary assets and liabilities are translated into NZD at the foreign exchange rate ruling at balance date. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance.

### **iii. Goods & Services Tax**

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

### **iv. Accounts Receivable**

Accounts Receivable are stated at expected realisable value.

### **v. Income Tax**

The Society has charitable status and is therefore exempt from income tax. The Society was registered with the Charities Commission in December 2007. (CC20231).

### **vi. Stock**

Stock of tennis balls are recorded at original cost price.

### **vii. Leases**

The entity leases certain land and buildings.

The operating lease payments, where the lessors effectively retain substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased property, are included in the determination of the Net Deficit for the year.

### **viii. Comparative Figures**

The comparative figures represent the 12-month period to 30 April 2009.

### **ix. Consistency**

Other than the revaluation of assets, there has been no material changes in accounting policies during the year.

All other policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in the previous year.

#### 2. SHORT TERM BORROWINGS

##### ASB Bank

##### (a) Overdraft facility

The overdraft facility is unsecured and the current interest rate is 11.75%

##### (b) Cash Advances

This facility has a limit of \$250,000 of which \$Nil has been drawn. It is unsecured. The facility is on a continuing basis and the current interest rate is 11.75%.

#### 3. AUCKLAND TENNIS CHARITABLE TRUST

Funds were advanced by the Trust. These funds carry no interest charge and are repayable upon 12 months notice.

#### 4. FIVE YEAR SEATS

The receipts from five year Redwood and Robinson grandstand seats have been brought into revenue as to 1/5<sup>th</sup> of total receipts for the year. The balance of the account disclosed under Current Liabilities represents the prepaid portion to be brought to revenue over the next 12 months and the amount under Non Current Liabilities represents the prepaid portion to be brought to revenue over the next 2 to 4 years.

#### 5. LONG TERM BORROWING

##### a) ASB Bank Mortgage

This mortgage is made up of an advance of \$2,000,000 with principal of \$591,173 remaining payable.

This loan is currently subject to an interest only regime. There is a right to make lump sum payments off the loan when funds are available.

The current interest rate is 5.35 % p.a. on \$591,173.

##### b) Auckland City Mortgage

The principal outstanding on this Mortgage is \$67,500

The terms of the total Mortgage advance are:

- Interest rates are reviewable periodically
- Principal repayments are \$12,500 per quarter
- Total grants from Auckland City against this mortgage amount to \$500,000.

The loan is secured by a registered mortgage over the Tennis Auckland Region (Inc) land at Merton Road, Glen Innes.

### 6. VALUATION OF LAND BUILDINGS & IMPROVEMENTS

The buildings and improvements at the ASB Tennis Centre, Scarbro Tennis Centre and Manukau Tennis Centre were valued by an independent registered valuer on 27 April 2009 for insurance purposes at a reinstatement cost estimate of \$22,615,000.

The Buildings and Improvements have been revalued this year to their insured values. This revaluation is to recognise the ongoing value of those assets that have previously been written down by the annual depreciation charge. Land has been revalued to its rateable value.

The ASB Tennis Centre has been excluded from this revaluation due to the redevelopment now in progress. Upon completion, the ASB Tennis Centre will be included in the revaluation.

During the year, \$262,505 was expended on the SQUID car park project and this amount has been capitalised.

These assets are owned by Tennis Auckland (Incorporated) and the Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust.

### 7. CAPITAL COMMITMENTS

At balance date, there were Capital commitments as follows:

- Forward exchange contracts of \$1,404,431 maturing on 31 December 2010 in respect of prize money relating to the major events to be staged in January 2011. (2009 \$903,833)
- The redevelopment of the ASB Tennis Centre commenced in January 2010.

### 8. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

There were no contingent liabilities at balance date (2009 Nil).

### 9. EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO BALANCE DATE

There are no known events to have occurred after balance date.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2010

### 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These are the financial statements of Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust. Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust is a Charitable Trust established under Charitable Trusts Act 1957. The Trust is reporting pursuant to the requirements of its Trust Deed.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

The Trust qualifies for differential reporting based on the following criteria:

- It is not publicly accountable and
- The Trust is 'not large' as defined by the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants

The Trust has adopted all available differential reporting exemptions.

#### **Measurement System**

The measurement system adopted is that of historical cost.

#### **Particular Accounting Policies**

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Trust in the preparation of these financial statements

#### **Buildings**

Buildings are included at cost less aggregate depreciation provided at the rates shown in the Schedule of Buildings.

#### **Income Tax**

The Trust has charitable status and is therefore exempt from income tax.

#### **Investments**

Investments are stated at cost.

#### **Goods and Services Tax**

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

#### **Leases**

The reporting entity leases certain land.

Operating lease payments, where the lessors effectively retain substantially all of the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased items, are recognised in the determination of the operating surplus in equal instalments over the lease term.

#### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.
