From the Chair

SIMON VANNINI

REVIEW

Tennis Auckland has had a very successful year, and it gives me great pleasure to summarise some of the highlights. The Board feels that we are making great progress in pursuit of our vision to make tennis a part of every Aucklander's life.

Brent Robinson has had his first full year with us as CEO, and he and his team have delivered on a number of our key strategic initiatives during this financial year.

The key activities and achievements of Tennis Auckland are summarised in the CEO's report. We are again delighted with the performance of the ASB Classic and Heineken Open, and in particular the performance of some New Zealand players. The two weeks of international tennis continues to grow in profile and enables Aucklanders to experience truly world class tennis. I would like to take this opportunity in particular to thank our sponsors for their continuing support of these tournaments.

We have continued to seek to engage better with members and clubs throughout the year, to understand their challenges and how we can assist them. The Membership Growth Project was successfully rolled out to some pilot clubs, and we have had great feedback on this initiative. We are also engaging with clubs to provide information and support through regular meetings, to deal with matters which clubs are telling us are important to them.

Our operating surplus for the 12 months ending June 2015 was \$842,764, against the result of \$13,599 for the 14 months ending 30 June 2014 (due to our move last year to a 30 June financial year).

The graphs show the changes in operating surplus and equity in total assets over the past 10 years. It is very pleasing to see the positive changes which have occurred over recent years, providing Tennis Auckland with the financial security to continue to deliver its strategy.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION

The Board took the opportunity with the new CEO to start to review the strategic plan. The Board has instructed the CEO to focus in particular on raising the profile of tennis throughout the region (through domestic tournaments and other activities), as well as encouraging participation.

The CEO has also been tasked with progressing the ASB Tennis Arena development project, including the

roof and associated amenity and capacity upgrades. We anticipate that this project will take at least 3 years to progress, and there will be significant fundraising required in order to complete this project. The Board remains committed to delivering this project, as a necessary step to protect the international tournaments, as well as enabling Tennis Auckland to continue to profile and promote the sport of tennis in Auckland.

We continue to work closely with Tennis NZ to assist their strategy. In particular, the Tennis NZ High Performance Strategy enables Tennis Auckland to be a feeder into that targeted strategy.

As already mentioned, our international tournaments continue to perform strongly. We remain under pressure to obtain high profile players, against increasing competition from other tournaments. It is important that we continue to work hard to promote our tournaments as a destination, along with Auckland as a place to visit, to continue to grow these tournaments.

GOVERNANCE

Our Board has continued to deal with a significant amount of work during this year. We have board subcommittees dealing with audit and risk, employment and property, which involves a significant time commitment by Board members during the year.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The Board would like to acknowledge the important role that Judy Bent has played this year in her role as President. Judy was a member of the Tennis Auckland Board for a number of years, so was able to bring that background and experience to the President's role. Judy's long involvement in playing tennis and club administration meant she has been able to provide the Board with input around matters which are important to clubs, as well as ably representing Tennis Auckland at a number of events during the year.


We would like to thank our CEO Brent Robinson and his team, for continuing to deliver fantastic results for our organisation, while focussing on effective and efficient delivery.



From the Chief Executive

BRENT ROBINSON

The 2014/15 year is one that everybody involved with tennis in Auckland should look back on with pride. Together we have made significant progress in the areas of club support, membership, facilities, tournaments and performance, all while delivering a very strong financial result. While there is a lot of work still to do we are moving positively toward our goal of making tennis a part of every Aucklander's life.

MEMBERS

We all strive to grow membership across our region and in 2014/15 membership numbers grew by 1.5%. This is the third consecutive year of growth in membership; a result we should be proud of and a testament to all the great work being done by the clubs. That said, tennis is no different to others sports in seeing an increase in casual participation and we will continue to work with clubs to help everybody benefit from the opportunities this trend provides.

Given these trends it is imperative that we all adapt our offerings in order to continue to bring people into tennis. 2014/15 saw the second year of the Club GROWTH Program; a program based on helping clubs identify areas they need support with and then providing relevant resources and guidance along the way. The results are very encouraging, with clubs engaged in the program seeing membership increase 10.1% on average. We will continue to add to the resources, workshops and case studies that are available; supporting clubs will always be at the core of what we do and building on the Growth Membership Program will continue to be a priority.

In an incredible final that went down to the final tie-break played at well after midnight, Blockhouse Bay finally claimed the coveted Men's Scarbro Caro Bowl after going so close in recent years. Meanwhile Sunny Hills followed up their first ever Women's title by going back-to-back. Congratulations also to Mission Bay and Bucklands Beach Tennis Clubs who won the Senior and Junior Interclub Club of the Year awards respectively. These winners along with many others were recognised at the Tennis Auckland awards. It is very important to celebrate success, and the evening was a wonderful occasion that is fast becoming a highlight of the calendar.

We have now delivered the Hot Shots introductory tennis program to over 30,000 children in the region in the last 3 years. A key focus for us is to see the Hot Shots program develop ongoing partnerships between schools and clubs and I strongly encourage every club to embrace this opportunity.

EVENTS

This was a fantastic year for the January tournaments. We were again blessed with great weather and everybody present should feel privileged to have seen a true tennis legend in Venus Williams add her name to the illustrious list of winners in Auckland. Jiri Vesely proved the best of the new breed in the Heineken Open while Michael Venus' 3-set win on Tuesday night delivered an atmosphere that will last long in the memory. Delivering the ASB Classic and Heineken Open is a huge, complex undertaking and the small Tennis Auckland team and hundreds of volunteers continue to deliver one of the best sporting events in New Zealand. This was reinforced with the Heineken Open winning the Best Fan Experience Award from the ATP for the second year running - a direct result of the wonderful experience delivered by our tournament team and all the volunteers. Thank you very much for all your fantastic work.

This year also saw the semis and finals of the NZ Championships held at the ASB Tennis Arena. While the weather worked against us it was a fantastic opportunity for tennis having this event covered live on Sky TV for the first time, and I would ask as many of you as possible to again support the event this year.

FACILITIES

This year saw us begin a program of investment back into the facilities that give so many Aucklanders opportunities to play the game. We began much needed resurfacing and roof work at the Scarbro Tennis Centre; this is an expensive facility to operate and we have work to do to ensure we are delivering the right mix of programs in a financially sustainable manner in the future.

2014/15 saw us complete an Auckland Tennis Facilities Study in partnership with Tennis Northern and Auckland Council. This gives us an excellent understanding of our existing tennis facilities and our future needs given the expected growth in Auckland's population. Funders will prioritise sports which present an aligned plan with regards to facilities investment and this piece of work is key to ensuring Aucklanders can easily access tennis now and in the future.

Detailed design work is well under way for the redevelopment of the ASB Tennis Arena, with resource consent submission likely in the coming months. The January tournaments are both the showpiece for tennis in New Zealand and a critical enabler for the rest of the sport. The age and condition of parts of the ASB Tennis Arena mean that upgrading the facility is essential if we are to future proof these events; however an undertaking of this magnitude must be carefully managed.

COMPETITIVE PERFORMANCE

A change in timing and format saw our best under 12, 14 and 16 girls and boys come together for the National Junior Teams Event in January. After missing out by the narrowest of margins in 2014 it was fantastic to see our team take out the Champion Region trophy for the year. Congratulations to all the players, coaches and parents who put so much time into preparing and competing at this event.

The Scarbro Tennis Centre will again host the Under 12 and 14's team and individual nationals in January and I would encourage you to get along and support our best and brightest as they take on the rest of the country.

ORGANISATIONAL EXCELLENCE


2014/15 sees us report an excellent operating surplus for the year. This is a testament to all of our managers and their teams; to a person they have delivered strong results in a financially sustainable manner. Delivering and growing sport in New Zealand can be a financial challenge and it is therefore imperative that we use the positive years to build our equity and future-proof the sport.

It is critical to thank our sponsors and funders, without whom we could not deliver the programs and events that grow tennis in Auckland. As I look back on the year and think of the Delegates forums, AGM's, club open days and January tournaments it is staggering the amount of time that people give freely to our game. I would like to sincerely thank each and every one of you who contributes to tennis so passionately, as without your contribution we would be all the poorer as a sport.

I would like to acknowledge the Tennis Auckland Board, who continue to freely offer their time and expertise for the betterment of tennis in our region. Tennis Auckland has a range of responsibilities and stakeholders more complex than most, and we are extremely fortunate to have the skills that our board members bring. I would also like to thank Judy Bent who has done a wonderful job in the role of President.

Lastly a huge thank you to the team at Tennis Auckland; they are a small but incredibly passionate group of tennis lovers who want nothing more than to see the sport flourish. I would also like to thank their families; working in sport is a privilege but requires the commitment of many hours outside the norm. As a team we will continue to challenge ourselves to do everything we can to grow the game of tennis in the Auckland region.





From the President

The 2014-2015 year has been a particularly successful year for Tennis Auckland and its affiliated member clubs. It is also one that I have personally enjoyed as your President.

One of the highlights each year is the Festival of Tennis, with the ASB Classic & the Heineken Open. This year was no exception, with superb fields and great weather, a combination of which led to sell-outs from Wednesdays onwards. The effort and hours put in by the small army of volunteers and the Tennis Auckland staff is very impressive.

Top New Zealand players were also showcased at the ASB Tennis Arena with the New Zealand Championships in December, supported by Sky TV, & the Davis Cup tie in March.

The end-of-season awards' night in May was a great success and a celebration of the excellence of clubs and players. Congratulations to all award recipients, to clubs who won their section(s), and in particular to Mission Bay Tennis Club for receiving the Club of the Year Award. Congratulations also to Blockhouse Bay, finally winning the Men's Scarbro Caro Bowl final after several close runners up finishes, and Sunnyhills defending the Women's title.

Of particular note, the following were honoured with Awards from Tennis New Zealand:

The Membership Growth Project, which was in partnership with Tennis Northern, and with input from an overseas expert, Paul Regan, progressed this year. Twentyone clubs (fifteen from Tennis Auckland) were a part of a pilot scheme designed to improve club capability. Tennis Auckland worked closely with the clubs and all but three increased membership, with the average increase over the fifteen clubs being 10.1%. Over the fifty-two Auckland Region clubs the average increase was 1.5%. This is a great result when clubs nationally, and in other sports codes, are generally seeing a fall in affiliated membership.

Tennis Auckland continues to supports clubs in many other ways, from workshops, the most recent being one on funding, and the provision of relevant information at Delegates' meetings, to all the organization for interclub and tournaments. To those clubs who do not regularly send a delegate to the meetings, I urge you to reconsider; they enable clubs to keep up with the changing environment and legislation, and to learn how other clubs resolve common issues. Tennis Auckland's schools and coaching programs are also very successful.

On a sad note, over the past year we lost three very wellknown members of the Tennis Auckland community. They were Jim Lewis, father of Chris, Mark & David and a well-known and regular attendee at the major events; Ray Keenan, President 1990-1991; and Athol Tills, President 1977-1978. Our sympathy and best wishes are extended to their respective families.

We are blessed with a very impressive Board, under the dynamic Chairmanship of Simon Vannini. They willingly give their time and expertise, and on behalf of the clubs I wish to thank them. I would also like to thank Brent Robinson, the CEO, the senior management team, and the staff of Tennis Auckland for their commitment and hard work over the past year. Without all this the successes of Tennis Auckland would not have been possible.

A thank you to the clubs who have welcomed me to their special occasions, and to those who have contacted me regarding various issues. It is gratifying to observe how strong the club spirit generally is, and the strength of the volunteer base in most clubs. It has been a privilege and joy to be your President for the past year. I wish Don Cotter, the incoming President, all the best for the 2015-2016 year.

Year in Review

2015 ASB Classic & Heineken Open

KARL BUDGE - TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR



Blazing sunshine, record breaking crowds and an improved fan experience paved the way for our best ever tournaments for the second edition of the NZ Festival of Tennis. Building on the success of the new chapter the Festival created in 2014, 2015 saw an increase in the onsite entertainment experience, a focus on engaging new audiences and the strongest player line ups in a number of years.

It was a superstar ASB Classic line-up headlined by global superstar Venus Williams and tour glamour girl Caroline Wozniacki, whilst Sara Errani (14), two time Grand Slam champion Svetlana Kuznetsova (27), Barbora Zahalova-Strycova (25) and rising American stars Sloane Stephens (34) and Coco Vandeweghe (37) provided guality right down the field. The world's number one team of Errani and Roberta Vinci were top seed for the doubles draw and showed their class to claim the title in front of a sellout finals day crowd. Kiwi hope Marina Erakovic made it through to the second round in both singles and doubles whilst the dream final for the second year in a row came to fruition with Williams and Wozniacki battling it out in a three set epic. It was the popular American who went one better than her 2014 result to claim her 45th career title and vowed to return to defend her crown in 2016.

If the tennis gods shone on the ASB Classic, it was a more challenging start to the Heineken Open. After securing the strongest field ever assembled with an incredible seven players ranked inside the world's top 20, injury meant David Ferrer (7), John Isner (12), Gael Monfils (14) and Tommy Robredo (19) had to withdraw prior to the start. Thankfully the depth of field that had been put together still meant there were three top 20 players (Gulbis, 13, Bautista-Agut, 15 and Anderson, 16) and an impressively low cut off of just 61 (the lowest ranked player to get in to the draw directly). Future stars Dominic Thiem and Borna Coric continued the Auckland tradition of unveiling future stars whilst Michael Venus became the first Kiwi in 12 years to win a first round match in what was one of the highlights of the fortnight to reach the second round. However it was the unheralded Czech Jiri Vesely who became the first qualifier in 30 years to win the title sending down serves in excess of 225kph en route to beating Frenchmen Adrian Mannerino in the final.

More than 58,000 fans came through the gates during the two weeks whilst a cumulative domestic audience of 1.45 million viewers tuned in to watch the events on Sky Sports and Prime Television. Coverage was beamed to more than 200 million homes internationally peaking in the USA where more than 32 million people had access to the Events.

A new mobile website was developed in giving dynamic viewing across all devices with live feeds provided by both Tours, giving instant access to real time results and schedules. 383,274 visitors came to the site across the two weeks, up 18% on 2014 whilst our social channels thrived, up 32% from the previous year led by the brilliant ASB Ball Dogs video which received more than 4.8 million views around the world!

The continued focus to engage new markets and a real emphasis on non-sporting media resulted in more than \$8.5 million in domestic media and PR value achieved with the Events being the lead sports story throughout January. Features in the likes of Metro Magazine, Viva and Dish provided access to non-traditional tennis fans in the lead up to the Events starting, resulting in record setting crowds.

The fantastic year was capped off by being voted the Best International Tournament by the WTA players at the end of season awards whilst the Heineken Open won Best Fan Experience for the second year in a row at the ATP awards in Wimbledon.






























Delivering Tennis in Clubs and Schools

SCARBRO CARO BOWL

Another great season for our premier competition with most of New Zealand's leading players taking the court to represent their clubs. The Men's Scarbro Caro Bowl was won for the first time after many years of finishing second by Blockhouse Bay who defeated defending champions Parnell in an exciting final that went down to the wire.

The Women's Scarbro Caro Bowl was won by Sunnyhills for the second consecutive year when they defeated Parnell in the final.

Congratulations to all teams, players, managers and supporters for continuing to make this the best competition of its kind in the country. A special thank you to our long time sponsors Scarbro for their continued support.

SENIOR INTERCLUB

The Senior Interclub competition attracted 388 team entries in the 2014-15 season with thousands of club members enjoying competitive play for their clubs on Saturday afternoons over the summer months. The twilight and winter competitions also proved to be popular for those players wanting more options outside of the traditional Saturday afternoon play.

The administration of this competition is a major exercise with over 50,000 matches played in a season. The adoption of Configure Rankings for entries and the making of draws has simplified the delivery of senior interclub over the last couple of years but it is a credit to everyone involved that we have so many tennis club members participating throughout the year.

Thanks to all interclub controllers, team captains and players for your efforts.

The Senior Interclub Club of the Year was Mission Bay Tennis Club.

JUNIOR INTERCLUB

Pre Xmas team entries were strong at 328 and it is pleasing to see clubs getting their teams organized so their junior members can participate in junior interclub before Xmas. The post Xmas competition attracted 355 teams and it was encouraging to see even more juniors involved in the second half of the season. Congratulations to Royal Oak (Girls) and Pakuranga (Boys) for winning the Scarbro Junior Caro Bowl competition for 2014-15. A big thank you to Ross Morrison for supervising this segment of the junior interclub competition and to all of the interclub controllers and team captains for their volunteer contribution.

The Junior Interclub Club of the Year was Bucklands Beach Tennis Club.

MIDWEEK LADIES

Team entries for the season were 191 in total with 93 teams listed for the Lead-In Pre Xmas and 98 teams for the summer swing. For the first time the Midweek Ladies competition winners were included in the Tennis Auckland Awards Evening and this was appreciated by those in attendance who were warmly welcomed by the wider Tennis Auckland family.

The Midweek Ladies Club of the Year was Kohimarama Tennis Club.

We would like to acknowledge the support of NZCT and First Sovereign Trust for their support of these areas of community tennis.

WINTER INDOOR COMPETITIONS

Tennis Auckland continues to offer the popular indoor competitions to players wanting a midweek tennis opportunity. Entry numbers increased for the Ladies Indoor Singles and Doubles events and the Evening Indoor competition played at Scarbro Tennis Centre and the ASB Tennis Arena again proved popular during Terms Two and Three. Tennis Auckland organized two very popular add on events for the indoor ladies competitors this year in the form of a Pro-Am and a coaching clinic by Marina Erakovic and Mark Lewis. Both of these events were enjoyed by the women who took part. The Ladies Indoor competitions were supported by Wilson and we would like to thank them for their contribution.



KIDS ENJOYING THE HOT SHOTS PROGRAMME

TENNIS HOT SHOTS AT SCHOOLS

This year 7921 primary school aged students from 39 schools participated in four week Tennis Hot Shots Programmes delivered by registered Tennis Hot Shots coaches in the Auckland region. Equipment was funded for any schools that had not previously participated in a tennis programme.

Over 30,000 school aged children have experienced the enjoyment of Tennis Hot Shots at their own school over the last three years. The four week model adopted enables the development of new skills by individual participants and the coaches who deliver these programmes are given a real opportunity to sell the sport and encourage players to consider out of school tennis activities at the local tennis club.

CLUB SUPPORT

The Membership Growth Project concluded this year after nearly two years of input from Tennis Auckland, Tennis Northern and industry expert Paul Regan. The initial project phase involved surveys, presentations and consultations with member tennis clubs. The second stage of the project saw 21 clubs expressing interest in being a part of a pilot scheme designed to improve club capability. Fifteen of those clubs were from the Auckland region and Tennis Auckland worked closely with most of them over the course of the project.

Clubs were required to complete a fact finding selfassessment and meet with the project team to form a plan of action around volunteers, coaching, membership options, promotions and communication. Resources authored by Paul Regan were issued to provide advice to the clubs as they set about completing tasks set in accordance with prescribed action plans.

The results in terms of affiliated number increases were very pleasing. Of the 15 clubs in Auckland, 12 managed to increase membership while only 3 reported less than the previous year. The combined increase in affiliated numbers for all fifteen clubs was a staggering 10.1%. This was a major factor in the gentle rise in affiliated membership across the 52 clubs in Auckland of around 1.5%.

Club support is a priority going forward and Tennis Auckland will continue to work with the pilot clubs and add more to the list over time. A user friendly online self-assessment questionnaire is in the final stage of development and this will be a tool for clubs to use on an annual basis to benchmark performance. The resource suite will also be made available to our clubs providing information and ideas that will eventually help clubs improve capability. Furthermore, Tennis Auckland plan to conduct series of workshops on relevant topics for clubs to share information and put together a portfolio of successful club case studies to promote the excellent work that clubs do in our city for the game of tennis. Last but not least, the Club Liaison and Support Committee have taken on a more pro-active role working with some affiliated clubs to help improve capability and these efforts will carry on into the future.

Tennis Auckland would like to acknowledge the contribution made by Paul Regan to the Membership Growth Project and to Tennis Northern for the work they have done in partnership with us. Finally, we would like to recognize the outstanding efforts made by the pilot clubs to support this project.

Tennis Auckland's Super City Tennis Academy delivered 680 hours of quality training sessions to over 100 tournament players during the course of the 2014/2015 year. These sessions were structured around 5 fundamental pillars (Coaching, Physical Conditioning, Personal Development, Mental Skills and Match Play). In addition to the on-court coaching component, players and parents had access to seminar evenings and physical testing sessions ensuring that once again Tennis Auckland's regional players had the opportunity to learn and develop in a comprehensive and professional environment under quality registered coaches.

Tennis Auckland's "inclusive" regional approach to coaching, adds value to a player's existing private coach programme and is in alignment with Tennis New Zealand's 2014 – 2017 player development pathway.

DAVID J. SMITH - PRESIDENT 2014/15

It gives me great pleasure to present for your consideration my President's Report for the 2014/15 year which will cover the key highlights of the last 12 months of our Association and our members.

There are limited opportunities to officiate locally at the highest level which is why our top officials must either travel or base themselves overseas to fulfil their officiating ambitions. A few weeks ago, Melissa Rigby travelled to China to attend an ITF Chair Umpire's School and I am delighted to record that she passed this school and attained her White Badge which will now set her on a pathway for higher officiating opportunities.

Both Blaze and Dimitar Trifunovski have officiated extensively over the last year primarily overseas. Blaze now lives in Germany and over the last year he has officiated as a chair umpire in 65 matches on the ATP/WTA tour and Grand Slams plus 22 weeks as a Review official, having become one of the most respected and competent review officials in the World. One of the highlights was his officiating at the ATP Finals in London late last year and the Novak Djokovic vs Roger Federer Wimbledon Final as the Review Official.

His son, Dimitar, has similarly excelled officiating 40 matches as a Chair Umpire on the ATP/WTA Tour plus Grand Slams plus 2 weeks as a Review Official. Dimitar continues to be the #1 ranked line umpire in the World in the ranking's released in May 2015, a position he has now held for 2 consecutive years. Some of his highlights include being a linesman at the US Open Men's Final, the ATP Finals in London and the Wimbledon Men's Final in only his 3rd year officiating at Wimbledon, which is a most unusual feat as this normally takes considerably longer to be selected for Wimbledon Finals. To put this in perspective line umpires can officiate at Wimbledon for 5 years or more before going on to centre court and often up to 10 years before being selected for a final. The visible local public highlight of our officiating year was the ASB Classic and the Heineken Open with David Smith and Stephen Noble the respective Referees and Stephen Noble and Christine McKnight the respective Chief of Officials. David Smith also officiated in 3 Davis Cup Ties overseas including the World Group Play-Off Tie between Australia and Uzbekistan.

Auckland Secondary Schools' Tennis Association

The secondary school Saturday competition in 2015 involved 228 teams, somewhat less than 2014. Some North Shore schools transferred teams from the Saturday competition to the Monday afternoon competition run by Tennis Northern, which involved 61 4-member teams in Term 1. There are 52 schools represented including the North Harbour competition.

Secondary school tennis continues to be a popular summer sport but, unfortunately, due to the changing length of Term 1, probably not long enough for seniors who do not currently have a Term 4 competition. Clearly there is a downward tendency in numbers but this is also a trend in many sports.

In the Champion of Champions tournament, St Kentigern dominated the Boys division with Connor Williamson of St Kentigern winning the senior singles to help his school win the James Aitkenhead Shield for overall school supremacy. Westlake Girls High School dominated the Girls division with Rosie Cheng winning the senior singles. Westlake won the Shield comfortably although the Selwyn College junior doubles win by Zara Cornwell and Holly Stewart prevented a clean sweep.

In the Auckland team competition held on Saturday morning the senior boys competition, after some problems agreeing on the format, was never completed in Term 1 and the semi-finals and finals will be played at the start of Term 4. Auckland Grammar won the junior boys while St Kentigern beat Auckland Grammar to win the intermediates in a very close contest. In the girls, Westlake, after a tiring week at the Nationals where they won, narrowly beat St Kentigern 5-4 in the seniors while St Cuthbert's won the intermediates and Westlake the juniors.

The Auckland Secondary Schools' Association is working closely with College Sport in order to give more responsibility to College Sport in the management of school tennis, both in organisation and financial matters. The schools will continue to give pertinent consultation but it makes sense to let a professional body take on the onus of running school tennis.

- Expressing collective responsibility for all aspects of the Boards performance.
- Continuing the improvement in Board and individual effectiveness, in the interests of Tennis Auckland as a whole.

- The Committee met 3 times during this financial period.
- This Committees Charter states its role is to review and recommend to the Board on matters pertaining to Health & Safety; and the appointment and performance of the Chief Executive and their direct reports.

3. Property Committee

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30TH JUNE 2015

Reporting Entity and Nature of Operations

Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and the Charities Act 2005.

The purpose of Tennis Auckland is to advance the sport of tennis in the region by enabling rewarding tennis opportunities for everyone on a sustainable basis.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the valuation of land and buildings and intangible assets.

The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars, which is the Society's functional currency, rounded to the nearest dollar.

In the application of NZ GAAP management are required to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised.

The following notes contain balances subject to significant estimates and judgements:

- Fair value of land and buildings
- Intangible assets
- Contingencies

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis.

The Society has charitable status and is therefore exempt from income tax. The Society was registered with the Charities Commission in December 2007 (CC20231).

The Financial Statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 20th August 2015.

Differential Reporting

The financial statements of Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) have been prepared in accordance with New Zealand Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (NZ GAAP); which in this report refers to Financial Reporting Standards (FRS) and Statements of Standard Accounting Practice (SSAPs).

The Society qualifies for differential reporting based on the following criteria:

- It is not publicly accountable and
- The Society is 'not large' in terms of criteria set out in the differential reporting framework

The Society has adopted all available reporting exemptions except for the inclusion of a Statement of Cash Flows.

From 1 April 2014, the new Financial Reporting Act 2013 has come into force replacing the Financial Reporting Act 1993, this is for entities reporting under the Charities Act 2005 with reporting periods beginning on or after 1 April 2015. This will be effective for the Society's 30 June 2016 year end. The change in legislation introduces a statutory requirement for the Society to prepare general purpose financial statements.

In addition to the change in legislation, the External Reporting Board of New Zealand ("XRB") has released a new accounting standards framework which establishes the financial statements to be applied to entities with statutory financial reporting obligations. The Society is currently reporting under Old NZ GAAP. Under the new XRB framework management expects that the Society will be reporting under the PBE Standards as applicable for Tier 2 not-for-profit entities. Management expects that this will impact the preparation and disclosures included in the financial statements.

Goods & Services Tax

Revenues, expenses, liabilities and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except for receivables and payables which are recognised inclusive of GST. The society prepares GST returns on an 'Invoice' basis.

Comparative Figures and Restatement of Prior Year

The 2015 financial year represents 12 months of activity from 1 July 2014 to 30 June 2015. The comparative 2014 figures represent 14 months of activity from 1 May 2013 to 30 June 2014.

In the current year intangible assets have been correctly reclassified from property plant and equipment and amortised. This has resulted in the reported deficit for 2014 be restated from \$(540,615) to \$(648,232).

Accounting Policies

The specific accounting policies set out in these Financial Statements are consistent for all periods presented in these Financial Statements.

There have been no material changes in accounting policies during the year. All accounting policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those in the previous year.

(iii) The value of the land in each location, taking into account the nature the uses permitted by each of the leases if applicable and the underlying zoning.

(iv) The terms and conditions of each of the leases as they affect both the range of uses permitted for the premises and the value and negotiability of the leasehold interest.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30TH JUNE 2015

Fixed Assets

Land and buildings are initially recorded at cost and are then re-measured to fair value. Fair value is determined every 3 - 5 years by an independent valuer to ensure that the fair value does not differ materially from the carrying value. A revaluation surplus or deficit is recognised as Other Income in the period it arises and recorded in the Asset Revaluation Reserve. Where a revaluation reserve deficit exceeds previous revaluation surpluses for an asset, the excess deficit is recorded in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Capital items less than \$500 are expensed.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged on a straight line basis on all property, plant and equipment over the estimated useful life of the asset. Land is not depreciated.
