From the Chair

ROGER PERRY

REVIEW

The last year could be characterised as consolidating the gains of recent years, while looking forward to exciting new possibilities in pursuit of our vision to make tennis a part of every Aucklanders life.

The year's activities and achievements are summarised in the CEO's report, but I would like to make special mention of the continued success of our "shop window", the Heineken Men's Open and the ASB Women's Classic international tournaments. Feedback on the 2013 event from players, sponsors and the general public was extremely positive.

I would also like to acknowledge the passion of our members who have actively contributed to the thought process of how we continue to improve the services we provide. We have undertaken a considerable change program in recent years, but we must continue to adapt and enhance our services to ensure tennis remains an outstanding sport to participate in.

We cannot invest in new services and facilities for our members unless we have a sustainable financial position, and this has been a strategic priority of the Board in recent years. We are pleased to report that the operating surplus for 2012/3, before depreciation and capital items, was \$447,684, just under last year's record result of \$471,333. An immediate benefit flowing back to members is the Scarbro Tennis Centre Levy, which was halved for 2012/3, can now be eliminated.

The balance sheet was strengthened during the year by the decision of the trustees of the Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust to wind up the Trust. As allowed under the terms of its Trust Deed, it passed its assets to Tennis Auckland and forgave the debt we owed.

The substantial strengthening of Tennis Auckland's financial position in recent years is shown on the two graphs with this report.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION

From a sustainable financial base, the Board continues to refine its strategic priorities.

The Board recognises that many sports are confronting stagnating club membership due to our changing lifestyles. Nonetheless, tennis clubs in Auckland service one of the fastest growing population centres in the country. Strong and vibrant clubs underpin tennis in Auckland, and the Board will be placing greater emphasis on how we can promote the sport to the growing Auckland population.

We will continue our focus on enhancing facilities for members. Planning has commenced on the next phase on the ASB Tennis Arena development which will improve amenities and increase capacity. We are also focusing on how we might modernize the Scarbro Tennis Centre, which remains largely in the same form as when it was built twenty years ago, to make it a more vibrant facility for use by members and the public.

Tennis NZ has announced a review of their High Performance strategy, and as result we intend to adapt the Tennis Auckland performance programme, including working more closely with Tennis Northern. We welcome the opportunity to work more closely with our colleagues from over the bridge to enhance development opportunities for junior players across the Super City.

We must continue to protect and enhance the international tennis tournaments, whose longevity as a sporting event is unique in New Zealand. These events are a focal point for our game, and create commercial opportunities for the benefit of all tennis. Over many years we have created an outstanding reputation for top quality tournaments and a wonderful player experience, but we recognise that competition from other events on the tennis calendar will only strengthen.

GOVERNANCE

Some long standing board members retired during the course of the financial year. We would like to thank the following for the considerable time, effort and passion they contributed in pursuing the vision of Tennis Auckland.

Alan Chester served as Chair of the Board for ten years. Alan had a great impact across all facets of the game of tennis. In a long list of achievements, he led the vision to create greater financial sustainability, to redevelop the ASB Tennis Arena, and to provide financial support to our aspiring players. The Board is delighted that Alan was honoured by being created a Life Member of Tennis Auckland.

Andrew Stone served on the board for seven years. Andrew's great contribution was to continuously demand that the Board challenge itself to achieve ever higher goals.

Judy Bent served on the Board for six years. Judy brought a great depth of club experience to the Board and she made a major contribution to the development of the new Constitution.

Peter Jenkins served as Secretary for 10 years. Peter was heavily involved in improving the governance processes of the Board.



The Board welcomed Howard Lewis as a new board member at the start of the year. Howard had recently served as President of Tennis Auckland in 2011/12. Howard's deep knowledge of tennis in Auckland is welcomed.

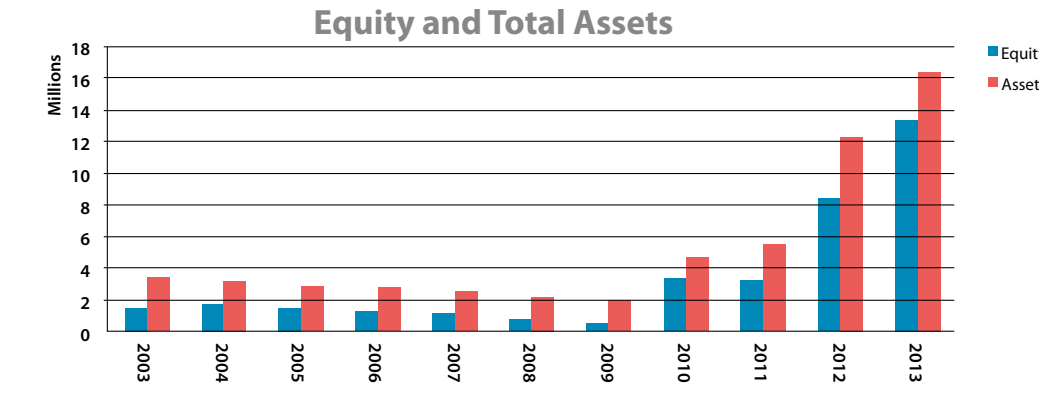
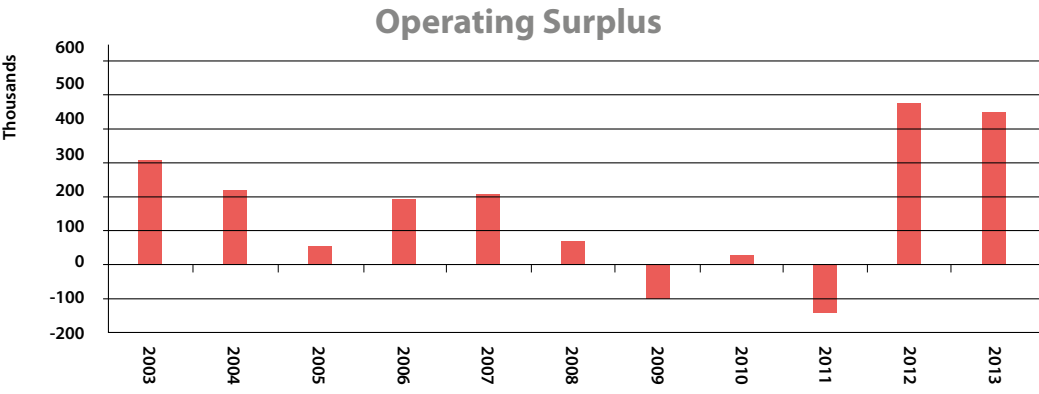

From the Chief Executive

During 2012 Tennis Auckland continued its journey of change with encouraging progress and pleasing results on many fronts. This was the first year of the new Strategic Plan for Tennis Auckland that has audacious goals for the key pillars in our organisation – members, events, facilities, competitive performance and organizational excellence and it has been gratifying to see the progress we have made towards our objectives.

MEMBERS

It is our aim to grow membership across our region and for the 2012/13 year we achieved this in both Tennis Auckland and Counties Tennis. Growth in participation is a key driver at many levels, including government support, and over the next twelve months we are embarking on projects to delve into how people play our sport and what we can do to grow participation levels in Auckland alongside a greater understanding of what tennis facilities we will need to cater for the sport in the next ten years.

We continue to work with clubs to add services and opportunities that will improve the sustainability of our member clubs. This year we have been working on a fundraising scheme with a new electricity provider that will have the potential to save money and raise funds with the support of club members and businesses working with our clubs in Auckland. The scheme is being piloted now with a view to a more regional rollout beginning in 2014.

Our interclub competition – both junior and senior – continues to be one of the largest in New Zealand and this season we introduced online registration and scoring that has significantly improved the administration and given all players easier access to their results and positions. Nyree Smith joined the Interclub Administration team and her quick learning and love of everything technology was a great boost for this transition.

The Tennis Auckland Awards, the highlight of our domestic events calendar, was a 'standing room only' affair this year. Many individuals and teams were recognized on the night and the stand out result was Sunnyhills Tennis Club who won Junior Interclub, Senior Interclub and Club of The Year awards this year.

EVENTS

The international tennis events are always a highlight in our calendar and this year proved no exception. Stunning weather and a strong player field, including the entertaining Gael Monfils, 'adopted son' David Ferrer and the skilled Aga Radwanska, made for a wonderful two weeks of tennis. The sold out sign went out on several days and the increased spectator seating on the back courts was regularly filled each day. New sponsor partnerships and a move to electronic on-court scoring added to the spectator experience and saw us on a clear path to reaching our goal with these iconic events. Our new Tournament Director, Karl Budge, joined Tennis Auckland in August and hit the ground running. His extensive knowledge of the professional tennis tours benefited our own tournament this year and in July we were awarded ATP250 Best Venue at the annual ATP Tournament meeting in London. This is a great accolade for a team of professionals and volunteers, many of whom hadn't worked together before, and makes us realize what we can achieve.

On the local front the Scarbro Caro Bowl was a closely contested competition this year with Parnell proving dominant in the men and Royal Oak taking out the women's title.

FACILITIES

With financial support for the next stage of the development of ASB Tennis Arena confirmed by Auckland Council we have been focused on a feasibility study to consider the best option for the next stage in preparation for submissions to potential agencies for further funding.

In the coming twelve months Tennis Auckland will participate in a national facilities strategy for tennis being led by Tennis New Zealand and funded by Sport New Zealand. The strategy will outline the tennis requirements moving forward over the whole of the country from a national and regional perspective. Contemporaneously we, and the affiliated clubs along with Tennis Northern, will work with Auckland Council on a facilities strategy for Auckland. This will focus on the sport's needs at a regional and club level when overlaid with the growth and participation trends of Auckland for the next ten years. By the end of this year our sport should have a well-researched blue print for future growth that can be used by all parties to maximize the growth of our sport.

COMPETITIVE PERFORMANCE

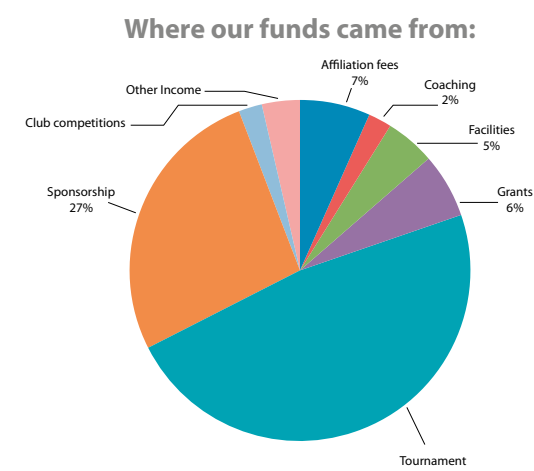
The junior players in Auckland really delivered on the national stage this year culminating with a talented group of young men and women winning an impressive four gold medals at the National Teams Event in April and silver in the other two age groups. The players and touring coaches were recognized at a General Meeting in May and it was truly heartwarming to see so many young talented players being congratulated by the member clubs. Hats off, not only to the players, but to their respective coaches, parents and supporters who all played a part in the outstanding success of our Regional Team this year.

Cameron Norrie, Auckland's most talented junior player, reached a career high ITF junior world ranking of 10 this year. Cameron, and his dedicated parents, worked hard throughout the year and we wish him well on the next part of his journey as he strives for international excellence under the watchful eye of the LTA.

ORGANISATION EXCELLENCE

For the second consecutive year we have reported a healthy operating surplus for the region. This is as a result of our managers taking responsibility for the fiscal performance of their respective departments and closely monitoring our performance throughout the year. A return to surplus is important to Tennis Auckland as we continue to build our financial reserves and ensure the ongoing financial sustainability of the region. During the year we received the benefits from the winding up of the Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust. This has led to an increase in our asset base and reduced our long term liabilities. Along with the revaluation of our existing major assets at the end of last year. This asset base has resulted in a significant increase in the depreciation charge that will have an ongoing impact on any surplus.

In the past twelve months we have received income from the following activities and spent it in the following areas:

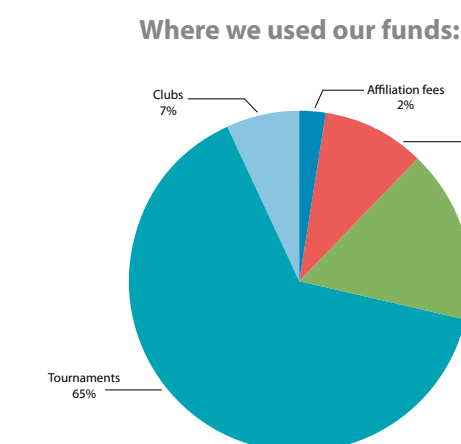

As an organisation we have had some noteworthy challenges and it is reassuring to have a Board that has considered the needs and wishes of a varied stakeholder group when meeting these challenges and contemplating the strategic direction for Tennis Auckland. Richard Buchanan, President for the past year has been a delight to work with and has chaired our meetings and forums in a gracious yet measured manner.

Our management team is a small group of professionals who continually punch above their weight to deliver the very best they can. This team has been through a lot of change over the past few years – and there is assuredly more to come – but they have risen to the challenge and produced some great results this year. Thank you for your support and enthusiasm.

Year in Review



ASB Classic & Heineken Open 2013

KARL BUDGE – TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR

Great weather, bumper crowds and two top five players graced the ASB Classic and Heineken Open in 2013. With six players ranked inside the top 30 featuring in the Women's field and seven in the men's, tennis fans enjoyed one of the strongest line ups in the events history.

World number four Agnieszka Radwanska defeated former champion Yanina Wickmayer (23) in a close fought final after coming through a strong ASB Classic field that featured two time Grand Slam champion Svetlana Kuznetsova, fan favourite Julia Goerges (18), former champion Zheng Jie (25) and highly touted youngsters Sorana Cirstea, Yaroslava Shvedova, Jamie Hampton and glamour girl Eugenie Bouchard.

In a special moment in the event's history, David Ferrer claimed his record equalling fourth Heineken Open title beating the second seed and world number 20 Phillip Kohlschreiber in the final. However it was the unseeded Frenchman Gael Monfils who stole the show. Slideman, as he is known, blasted through the opening rounds before winning what was arguably one of the greatest matches to be played at the ASB Tennis Arena getting past Tommy Haas in three brutal sets to set up a showdown against Ferrer.

Kiwi's Marina Erakovic and Daniel King-Turner featured in the singles main draw whilst young up and comers Paige Horrigan (16) and Cameron Norrie (17) had their first taste of elite tennis.

Over 55,000 fans came through the gates across the two weeks with the sold out sign being utilised for each of the last four days of the Heineken Open. At home, Sky TV viewer numbers increased by 15% to 1.3 million and, internationally, the events were beamed to more than 150 million homes.

Fans kept up to date on www.asbclassic.co.nz and www.heinekenopen.co.nz with 152,000 hits in January and more than 3.9 million impressions across the events and player Facebook accounts.

Entertaining the fans were renowned tenor Geoff Sewell, Ladi6, Dave Dallas and Rubi Frost with a special performance by Nesian Mystik frontman, Te Awanui Reeder, at the ASB Classic Players Party.

A team of more than 200 volunteers ensured the events ran smoothly with two recipients, Warwick Leathart and Mary Mouton, given an all expenses paid trip to the Sydney International to work as part of the volunteer programme. Prior to the tournaments, Tennis Auckland honoured those volunteers who had given 10 years or more of service. Incredibly on that night, more than 800 years of volunteer experience was acknowledged highlighting the loyalty our volunteer family is renowned for.



Delivering Tennis at Clubs and Schools

SENIOR INTERCLUB

Over 396 teams enjoyed the summer of senior interclub tennis this year making this competition one of the largest of its type in New Zealand tennis. The introduction of online team entries and results has proved successful and has immensely improved the administration of this competition.

Nyree Smith, with a background in the administration in water polo, joined our team this year and has quickly adapted to her new sport and its nuances.

Scarbro Caro Bowl produced the highest quality of matches in Auckland outside of the major tournaments. Congratulations to Parnell for reclaiming the Men's title and to Royal Oak who were long overdue for a victory in the Women's competition. Our sincere thanks to Scarbro Construction for their ongoing sponsorship of this event.

We are also grateful for the funding support from NZCT that assists with interclub administration and providing services to the clubs.

JUNIOR INTERCLUB

Junior Interclub team numbers increased this year and over the season we had 682 teams play in the competition. Once again online innovations greatly improved the running of this competition. Like our Senior Interclub this is one of the largest tennis competitions in the country.

The Scarbro Junior Caro Bowl was won by Cockle Bay in the Boys section and by Royal Oak 1 in the Girls competition. An enormous thank you to Scarbro Construction for its ongoing support of our premier junior club event and also to Ross Morrison for ensuring that the matches were played under supervision every Sunday afternoon.

The Tennis Auckland Junior Interclub "Club of the Year" Award was won by the Sunnyhills Tennis Club with an impressive number of teams competing and performing well throughout the entire season. Our thanks to Dawn Morrison for her management of the competition and ongoing support of the juniors in Auckland.

JACOB'S CREEK MID-WEEK LADIES LEAD-IN AND SUMMER INTERCLUB

This year we introduced a seven week competition for the Jacob's Creek Lead-in competition and that proved to be popular with the clubs. This means more tennis for more clubs which is great news for our sport in Auckland.

Team entry numbers were on a par with past seasons and the end of season Ladies Luncheon was well attended. Thank you to our sponsor Jacob's Creek for its support of these competitions. Congratulations to the Bucklands Beach Tennis Club which was named the Midweek Ladies Club of the Year.

EASI-TENNIS

This introductory tennis experience is gaining popularity with over 176 adults participating in the three week group coaching sessions between September and March at five different venues across Auckland. A 'Bring A Friend' offer proved popular this year as did new promotional platforms using social media.

This introductory format is a great way to transition new players into clubs and we strongly encourage all our member clubs to incorporate similar beginner type courses in their own coaching programmes.

SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

Grasshopper tennis programmes were delivered at 51 schools in Auckland during the past year to just over 11,000 primary and intermediate school aged children. These programmes were generously supported by Kiwisport through the Regional Sports Trusts and the continued support of the Four Winds Foundation.

'Making tennis a part of every Aucklanders life' is our mantra and the Grasshopper programme in schools including the provision and ongoing use of tennis kits at the schools certainly helps.

Feedback from the participating schools:

- "Very beneficial and the students loved it. Generated a lot of interest in taking up tennis in the future."
- "The children enjoyed it! Great coaches and appropriate activities."
- "Lots of excellent skills and a great opportunity for the children."
- "Having all children with a racquet in their hand. No waiting time. It was fun, interactive and new to most children. Very professionally organised and run."

Tennis coaching programmes were introduced at a number of Auckland Secondary Schools this year thanks to Kiwisport funding from the Regional Sports Trusts. Together with Tennis Northern we delivered coaching and equipment to six schools in the Auckland region and eight schools in the Waitakere region linked to the local tennis clubs.



Thanks to our Programme Partners Tennis New Zealand, Asics, Wilson, NatureBee, The Lion Foundation, and Infinity Foundation who again supported our regional performance programme this year.

Growing our Junior Talent

JAMES GREENHALGH – REGIONAL PERFORMANCE MANAGER

OVERVIEW

Tennis Auckland's Regional Performance Programme has been created for Auckland's aspiring junior tournament players to pursue their individual tennis goals. The coaching programme is based on international training standards and uses TNZ registered coaches. All the coaches and athletes are committed to the highest levels of professionalism and work towards continual development of their personal skills and knowledge to develop a culture of high performance. The criteria based programme sets clear goals for players and each of the three streams have been tailored to meet the needs of each player's ability and developmental levels. The training programme is athlete-centred and coach-driven. Coaches and athletes commit to achieving technical and tactical competency whilst developing psychologically, physically and socially. It is the programme's goal to develop independent tennis players equipped with the skill set needed to handle the challenges of an international tennis player's life.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

At a glance the Regional Performance Program delivered:

Unquestionably the highlight of Tennis Auckland Umpires' Association (TAUA) year is Dimitar Trifunovski being rated the #1 line umpire in the World following the US Spring tournaments. Dimitar was one of only 10 line umpires personally selected and invited to officiate at the ATP World Tour Finals in London for his 2nd consecutive year.

After completing his university studies last year, Dimitar has been officiating almost full time working most of the major US events in the latter part of last year including being one of the line umpires at the US Open Finals. Interspersed with this he has been a chair umpire at the NZ vs Lebanon Davis Cup Tie in February this year as well as more US events, Wimbledon and other lead up grass court events. These outstanding achievements are something we should all take pride in.

His father, Blaze, has had an equally outstanding year as he continues to make his mark as one of the leading review officials in the World with the pinnacle, apart from some 18 Major Events, being the review official for Wimbledon, 2 Fed Cup Ties and the ATP World Tour Finals. Additionally he has officiated as a chair umpire in 60 matches primarily ATP events plus 2 Davis Cup Ties in Europe.

TAUA members officiated at the ASB Classic and the Heineken Open with assistance from overseas officials. John Barry and David Smith were respectively the Referees of the ATP Heineken Open and WTA ASB Classic. Stephen Noble was the Chief of Umpires for both of these events as well as the Davis Cup Tie in Tauranga between NZ and

Lebanon. Additionally David Smith was the Referee for the Group II Davis Cup Final in Indonesia late last year plus 2 Ties earlier this year in the Philippines and India. John Barry was also the Referee for 2 ITF U18 Events.

This was reported at the February Delegates meeting.

Alan Chester – Life Member Tennis Auckland

Alan Chester was conferred Life Membership at a General Meeting of Tennis Auckland clubs in May 2013.

Life membership is a fitting accolade for a man who has devoted much of his life to the growth of tennis in Auckland and represented our sport on the international stage throughout a long playing career. Alan gave his all as an amateur player and equipped himself, the clubs he belonged to, his region and his country admirably from an early age.

As a keen player, Alan won his first title as a teenager at the National under 19s in 1957, and went on to as selected for the Junior Davis Cup team in 1961. But it was as a senior player that Alan came into his own, winning forty national senior titles in singles, doubles and combines. He represented New Zealand at senior ITF World Championships on ten occasions from 1991, which over an 18 year period saw him play in Australia, Europe and USA.

Not just a star on the court Alan was also recognised on many occasions by his community for his involvement in the sport at a local level. Alan was a member of many clubs throughout Auckland over the years with diverse membership bases and activities. Alan was awarded Personality of the Year by Papatoetoe City Council, and received Manukau Sports Excellence Awards. Alan Chester joined the Board of Tennis Auckland in 2004 following 10 years as Secretary to the Board. He served as Chair until his retirement from the Board in 2013. During that time he oversaw significant changes to the organisation, including the revision of the Constitution,



the development of ASB Tennis Arena, the addition of covered courts at the Manukau Tennis Centre, and a substantial strengthening of the financial position. Alan was further recognised with a Tennis New Zealand Tennis Administrator Award in 2005.

Following the restructure of tennis in New Zealand in 2006, Alan became a member of the Tennis New Zealand Board and served until his retirement in 2013. He brought both his tennis knowledge and business experience to the table for the betterment of the sport. His love of tennis and desire to see people succeed in the sport inspired him to establish the SEED Foundation in 2005, a philanthropic society that has raised \$800,000 to support aspiring young players. Alan also chairs the John Mickell Trust that assists senior players to represent New Zealand overseas.

Alan and his wife Janice are ardent supporters of both our sport and our Association. He enjoys the love and support of his family, including his two daughters, and his young grand-daughter who, we are told, is the apple of Grandad's eye.





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2013

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. REPORTING ENTITY

Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

The financial statements of Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) have been prepared in accordance with New Zealand Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (NZ GAAP).

The Society qualifies for differential reporting based on the following criteria:

- it is not publicly accountable and
- the Society is 'not large' as defined by the Institute of Chartered Accountants New Zealand

The Society has adopted all available reporting exemptions.

b. MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis except for assets that have been measured at fair value, are followed by the entity. Accrual accounting is used to recognise income and expenses as they occur. These financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars.

c. SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied:

i. Depreciation

Depreciation is charged on a straight line basis on all property, plant and equipment over the estimated useful life of the asset (except for land).

The following depreciation rates have been applied to the classes of property, plant and equipment.

ii. Fixed Assets

Buildings including improvements, Property, Plant and Equipment is recorded at cost plus any revalued amount less accumulated depreciation. Capital items less than \$500 are expensed.

Land is recorded at fair value.

iii. Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in foreign currency are, unless covered by forward exchange contracts, translated into New Zealand dollars at the spot rate or rate approximating this, at the transaction date

Transactions in foreign currency not settled in the accounting period resulting in monetary assets and liabilities are translated into New Zealand dollars at the foreign exchange rate ruling at balance date. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2013

- iv. Goods & Services Tax

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position. GST is calculated on a payments basis.
- v. Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are stated at expected realisable value after providing against debts where collection is doubtful. Bad Debts are written off during the period in which they are identified. Accrual Income represents income that has not been charged at balance date.
- vi. Income Tax

The Society has charitable status and is therefore exempt from income tax. The Society was registered with the Charities Commission in December 2007 (CC20231).
- vii. Stock

Stocks of tennis balls are recorded at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Some of the stock may be subject to reservation as to title.
- viii. Leases

The entity leases certain land, buildings and motor vehicles.

Where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased property, it is defined as an operating lease. Lease payments made are recognised over the term of the lease, in the determination of the Net Surplus for the year.
- ix. Contingent Liabilities

A contingent liability is recognised when a possible obligation arises from past events and whose existence will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non occurrence of one or more uncertain future event's not wholly within the control of Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated).
- x. Comparative Figures

The comparative figures represent the 12 month period to 30 April 2012.
- xi. Consistency

There have been no material changes in accounting policies during the year. In the previous year Land and Buildings were valued based upon fair value whereas Buildings and Improvements had been valued based upon insured value and Land on rateable value.

In the current year the economic life of some assets have been reassessed which has changed the depreciation charges.

All other policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those in the previous year.

2 GOING CONCERN

Reliance is placed on the assumption that Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated) will continue its operations indefinitely after balance date.

3 FACILITIES

Includes Carpark Rental of \$49,000 (2012 \$49,000).

4 ADMINISTRATION EXPENSES

Includes Audit Fees of \$11,200 (2012 \$10,400).

5 CAPITAL GRANT

A grant was received for works associated with the covered courts at the Manukau Tennis Centre.

6 AUCKLAND TENNIS CHARITABLE TRUST

The Auckland Tennis Charitable Trust pursuant to a High Court order transferred its assets to Tennis Auckland Region (Incorporated). These assets were applied to offset the loan to the Trust and to take up the Scarbro Tennis Centre building asset.

7 SHORT TERM BORROWINGS

- ASB Bank

(a) Overdraft facility
The overdraft facility is unsecured and the current interest rate is 11.50%. (2012 11.50%)
- (b) Cash Advances

This facility has a limit of \$250,000 of which Nil (2012 Nil) has been drawn. It is unsecured. The facility is on a continuing basis and the current interest rate is 6.65%. (2012 5.42%)

8 FOREIGN EXCHANGE

At balance date there are Forward Exchange Contracts maturing in January 2014 in respect of prize money and tournament costs related to the 2014 tournaments.

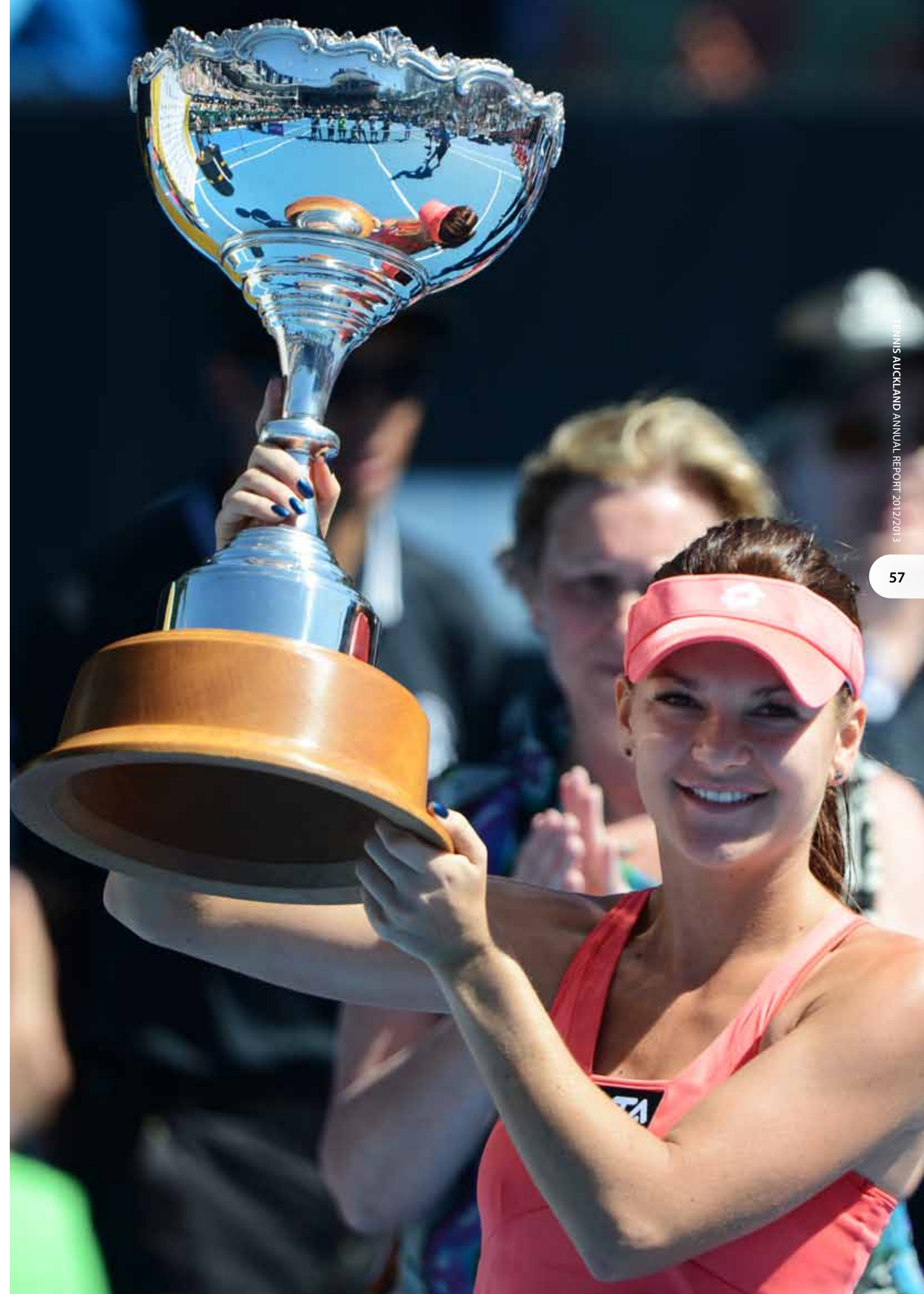
