



Orange Stage Level 1 Competencies

Area	Application to Tennis	Details
Serve	Serve	Serve with coordinated, balanced, rhythmical continuous action into different areas of the service box. Under the difference between a first serve and second serve.
Rally	Movement, groundstrokes, volley, play	Maintain balance while moving quickly sideways, forwards, and backwards. Use sidestep to recover. Return ball from a partner serve cross-court, down the line or middle. Use topspin on forehand and backhand with different speeds. Consistently rally cross-court. Use different speeds. Move opponent. Commence a competitive rally and score competitively.
Score	Score	Keep the score. Understand the main rules of the game.





Orange Stage Level 2 Competencies

Area	Application to Tennis	Details
Serve	Serve	Serve with coordinated, balanced, rhythmical continuous action. Differentiate speed between 1 st and 2 nd serves. Place the serve in different locations. Serve flat or with spin.
Rally	Movement, groundstrokes, volley, play	Maintain balance while moving quickly sideways, forwards and backwards. Use sidestep to recover. Return ball from a partner serve cross-court, down the line or middle. Use topspin on forehand and backhand and slice on backhand. Consistently rally cross-court. Use different speeds. Move opponent. Use drop shot, lob, passing shot, defensive shot. Approach net at correct time. Volley away from the opponent. Hit a smash and a drive volley. Commence a competitive rally and score competitively. Move opponent to win point. Hit to opponent's weakness.
